Archer's presentation was well-delivered, fast-paced but very disturbing. Archer reviewed many aspects of identity theft, those who want your information, what they do with it, what to do if you are a victim, and how to protect yourself. The FBI reports identity theft is the #I crime in the US for the past 6 years, and in 2012 increased by I3% affecting millions. Problems can extend beyond charges on credit cards and the cost for the hundreds of hours to remove negative information. Cyber-crime has made the news headlines in the past week with accusations of government-sponsored intrusion from North Korea, China, and others. At the other end of the spectrum, restaurant employees can pull information from credit cards, outgoing mail is stolen, and trash reveals personal information. In-between, high tech methods have involved installation of false fronts on ATM machines and individuals posing as someone you might trust.

Prevention methods can help, but none seems to be a guarantee.

- Guard your social security number and keep track of your wallet, purse, and credit cards.
- ♦ Don't give out personal information unless you have initiated the transaction.
- Don't pre-print your phone number on your checks.
- ♦ Contact credit card issuers before you travel outside the USA.
- ◆ Don't make payments on line unless the URI begins with *https*.
- Use a cross-cut shredder.
- Keep computer, phone and virus protection systems updated.
- ◆ EXPECT TO BE A VICTIM know what to do.

If you are a victim, file a police report, place a fraud alert with credit report companies, close affected accounts, file a complaint with the Federal Trade Commission, and keep thorough notes on all events and actions.




